Dirk Schoonmaker and Dave Gleske delivered a woman to safety from near Starrett Pass last month. Dirk, who is a firefighter with the North Tahoe Fire Protection District, was listening to his scanner on his day off when he heard about a woman who'd hurt her back during a snowmobile tour to Watson Peak.

When Dirk heard the overcast sky was prohibiting a rescue effort by available medical helicopters, he tracked down Dave, who drives one of the TNSAR snowcats. Together, the two drove a cat to the location and brought the




